Firstly apologies that we were unable to attend this meeting and for the delay in sending this message. All the Police units from Banchory area were tied up with ongoing enquiries and were consequently unable to attend.

There was nothing new for us to bring to you however we had hoped to be present to update you on the work being done regarding the speeding cars issues. The Torphins Playgroup have also written to the Inspector advising of their concerns regarding the speed of cars on St Marnan Road and he has responded to them.

What we are doing is:

- NESAMP contacted on 13-05-2010 and asked to spend time in the village
- Staff advised to spend time in the village with the muni and record same
- Birdie box request on 19-05-2010
- 20 May 1 hour survey by Traffic Wardens. 100 vehicles were subjected to the survey. Of those 6 were found to be over 35 mph, 2 were above 40 mph, the highest speed recorded was 47 mph. 21 were found to be in the 30-35 mph range and the remainder were under 30 mph.

We will continue to update further as we progress through our tasks in order to assess their effectiveness.
